Injury/Illness Procedure

If a participant is injured, appropriate first aid will be given, and 911 called as necessary. A parent/guardian will be notified as soon as possible. Authorization for emergency medical treatment must be signed prior to program participation. If a participant becomes ill, parent/guardians will be contacted to pick up youth as soon as possible.

Agreement of Mutual Respect

GMVCC is a place where everyone can feel safe and respected. To achieve this, program participants will agree to the following:

- Treat others with respect, and respect the authority of adult supervisors/chaperones.
- Abide by GMVCC's "zero tolerance" policy for:
 - Use or possession of illegal substances, including alcohol, tobacco, drugs, and/or drug paraphernalia.
 - Illegal gambling.
 - Use or possession of weapons of any kind.
- Obey the general laws of the land.

Youth will be encouraged to make good choices when relating to each other and to the adults in the program. They will be encouraged to practice conflict resolution skills and to work through any problems they may experience with another person. For the safety and security of all, threatening the safety of one's self, another person or property, or failure to abide by the "zero tolerance" policy, will result in immediate removal from program.

THE DEN GOVERNING RULES
Greater Maple Valley Community Center

GENERAL RULES _____ (Initial)

Anyone disobeying these rules will not be allowed access to The Den until, in the opinion of the staff, the behavior has been addressed. Parents will be notified. Appropriate action, including law enforcement involvement, will be taken.

- Anyone wishing to gain access or to be permitted inside The Den must have their card or temporary pass, **NO EXCEPTIONS**.
- The possession or use of weapons, alcohol, illegal drugs or tobacco products is strictly prohibited.
- If anyone is disrespectful to staff, volunteers, peers, or damages or enters into any activity that could lead to damaging equipment/property, in the opinion of the staff, parents will be notified and the person will be removed from The Den.

THE FOLLOWING ARE NOT PERMITTED _____ (Initial)

Any of the below can result in suspension from The Den. Additionally, youth can be suspended for any disrespectful or deviant behavior, in the opinion of the staff, not mentioned below.

- Foul Language
- Fighting
- Gambling
- Misuse or abuse of anything
- Failure to follow directions by staff
- Drug, Alcohol, and/or Tobacco usage
- Inappropriate Dancing and Moshing, in the opinion of the staff

I.D. Numbers _____ (Initial)

- A completed registration form and ID number are required for all members before entering The Den. There is a **\$35 annual registration fee** for drop in (playing games, hanging out with friends) and additional fees for activity nights. If this fee presents a hardship, scholarships can be made available. Please see youth staff for more info.

CHECKING IN/OUT EQUIPMENT/ GAMES _____ (Initial)

- You are responsible for all equipment signed out. Any loss or damage to equipment/ game will be your responsibility to replace.
- Check out only **ONE** item at time. You must check that item back in before checking out any other equipment/ game. **Do not let friends use an item** that you have checked out because you are **responsible** for that equipment/ game.

DRESS CODE _____ (Initial)

Youth attending The Den should dress in accordance with the Tahoma School District Dress Code. The staff at the Den appreciate help in creating a comfortable and safe atmosphere for all present.

DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP PARTICIPANTS _____ (Initial)

The Den is not responsible for participants that are dropped off in The Den's parking lot but do not enter The Den.

- Participants must enter the building before The Den and it's employees or volunteers take responsibility for them.
- Participants cannot be held at The Den against their will.
- Participants must be picked up promptly at the end of an event.
- Participants must not loiter in the parking lots

PERSONAL MEDICAL SUPPLIES _____ (Initial)

- In order to have access to personal medical supplies (inhaler, etc.) participants must have their name written on them and leave the item or items with a staff member.
- All medical supplies must have the participant's name clearly printed.
- Medical supplies must be taken home with the participants every day.





THE DEN COMPUTER USE POLICY

GENERAL POLICY

- The individual patron is responsible for proper use of the computer network, databases, and the Internet while at The Den.

CHILDREN'S INTERNET PROTECTION ACT (CIPA)

In accordance with the Children's Internet Protection Act, no person is permitted access to websites, chat rooms, or e-mails that contain obscene or sexually explicit material considered harmful to minors.

- Any individual that displays inappropriate materials will lose computer use privileges and may not be permitted to have an I.D. card or access to The Den.

SAVING FILES

Files may not be saved to the hard drive (C:). Individuals must save files to their own CD-R, CD-RW, or USB drive. The Den's computer's database will be erased every night to protect against viruses and other destructive computer programs.

PRINTING FILES

Individuals will be allowed to print ten pages each month. Beyond ten youth must have staff permission. Therefore, individuals are strongly encouraged to conserve paper and print only necessary materials.
